Gabrielle Gilliam, a native of Houston, TX, is a Fort Worth Opera Lesley Resident Artist as well as a Regional Finalist for the 2020-2021 Metropolitan Opera Council Auditions. This season, she starred in the world premiere of composer Joe Illick and Pulitzer Prize-winning librettist Mark Campbell's Bernadette's Cozy Book Nook and was part of Fort Worth Opera's inaugural FWO GO program. Prior to the U.S. outbreak of Covid-19, she was engaged to join the inaugural class of Studio Artists at The Dallas Opera. Her debuts included Amore in Orfeo ed Euridice and the Heavenly Voice in Don Carlo for the 2020-21 season. Gabrielle was also scheduled to make her debut with Tulsa Opera as Amore in Gluck's Orfeo ed Euridice. Praised for her "substantial and sweet timbre and bel canto flexibility" (Texas Classical), Gabrielle has been seen in previous seasons with The Dallas Opera's Outreach & Education program, portraying the roles of Bastienne in Mozart's Bastien and Bastienne and Dorabella in John Davies' The Bremen Town Musicians. This summer, Gabrielle joins The Florentine Opera Company as a Resident Artist. Ms. Gilliam is a graduate of the University of North Texas and has had engagements with Opera North, Opera in the Rock, and American Baroque Opera Co.
